*THANK YOU. I JUST CAME
FROM CAPITOL HILL, WHERE
SENATOR MITCHELL HAS
AUTHORIZED ME TO TELL
EVERYONE HERE THAT FOR
PURPOSES OF THE NEW TAX

LEGISLATION, YOU ARE CONSIDERED "RICH." *I DO WANT TO TALK A LITTLE **ABOUT THIS WEEK'S SENATE** DEBATE ON THE BUDGET, BUT FIRST I WANT TO SAY A FEW THINGS ABOUT THE FUTURE OF THE REPUBLICAN PARTY. *IT WAS JUST BACK IN JANUARY AND FEBRUARY, WHEN A LOT OF FOLKS IN THE MEDIA

HAD SAID THAT THE FUTURE
