INADEQUATE WEAPONS AND
U.N.-APPROVED RULES OF
ENGAGEMENT.

I BELIEVE PRESIDENT
CLINTON HAS RECEIVED THE

TO SEND FOR MONTHS: U.S.

SINCE THEN, THE ISRAELI KNESSET VOTED IN SUPPORT OF THE PEACE PLAN. JORDAN AND ISRAEL SIGNED AGREEMENTS LAYING OUT A NEGOTIATING AGENDA, AND A COMMON ECONOMIC FRAMEWORK. RABIN, ARAFAT, AND PRESIDENT MUBARAK MET IN CAIRO EARLIER THIS MONTH, AND ESTABLISHED WORKING **GROUPS ON SERIES OF ISSUES** 

AS THE DIFFICULT PROCESS OF IMPLEMENTING PEACE BEGINS.

THE U.S. HAS TAKEN THE LEAD IN MARSHALING THE INTERNATIONAL RESOURCES NEEDED TO FINANCE PEACE. AND THE U.S. SENATE MODIFIED SOME OF THE ANTI-PLO STATUTES ON THE BOOKS. THE NEWS IN THE LAST

MONTH HAS NOT, HOWEVER, BEEN ALL ROSY. SYRIA IS CONVENING A MEETING IN DAMASCUS TO TIGHTEN THE ARAB BOYCOTT OF ISRAEL. THERE HAS BEEN PRECIOUS LITTLE MOVEMENT ON THE PART OF ARAB STATES TO MOVE AWAY FROM THE BOYCOTT. IN FACT, I AM CURRENTLY

WORKING WITH SENATE **COLLEAGUES ON A LETTER TO** PRESIDENT CLINTON WHICH WOULD URGE HIM TO **ESTABLISH LINKAGE BETWEEN OUR ECONOMIC AID TO GAZA** AND THE WEST BANK TO PLO **COMMITMENTS ON LIFTING THE** BOYCOTT.

IT IS TIME FOR THE ARAB

BOYCOTT -- SUPPOSEDLY PUT IN
PLACE TO HELP THE
PALESTINIANS -- TO BE
RELEGATED TO HISTORY.

AND WHILE WE'RE ON THE
SUBJECT OF HISTORICAL
MISTAKES, THE U.S. OUGHT TO
USE SOME LEVERAGE ON THE
UNITED NATIONS TO SECURE
THE REPEAL OF THE MANY ANTI-

ISRAEL RESOLUTIONS PASSED
OVER THE YEARS -- AS THE U.S.
SENATE DID ON THE ANTI-PLO
STATUTES, AND AS PRESIDENT
BUSH SECURED THE REPEAL OF
OF THE NOTORIOUS "ZIONISM IS
RACISM" RESOLUTION.

ON THE GROUND IN THE MIDDLE EAST, VIOLENCE HAS NOT ENDED. THREE SENIOR PLO OFFICIALS SUPPORTIVE OF
THE "NEW ARAFAT" HAVE BEEN
ASSASSINATED. ATTACKS BY
HAMAS AND OTHER EXTREMIST
KILLERS CONTINUE.

SINCE THE SIGNING OF THE
ACCORD, SEVEN ISRAELIS HAVE

HAVE BEEN WOUNDED -- 30 IN A

SINGLE INCIDENT ON OCTOBER

4 WHEN A SUICIDE BOMBER

ATTACKED AN ISRAELI BUS IN

THE WEST BANK.

WHILE THE IMMEDIATE
BREAKTHROUGH BETWEEN
ISRAEL AND THE PLO
SURPRISED THE WORLD WHEN
IT WAS ANNOUNCED, THERE
WERE SEVERAL KEY LONGER-

TERM TRENDS WHICH MADE THE BREAKTHROUGH POSSIBLE FIRST, THE DYNAMICS IN THE MIDDLE EAST CHANGED UNDER PRESIDENT BUSH. **ALTHOUGH RELATIONS WITH** ISRAEL -- AND THE AMERICAN JEWISH COMMUNITY -- WERE SOMETIMES ROCKY WITH THE **BUSH WHITE HOUSE AND THE**

THE WAR IN THE PERSIAN

GULF REPRESENTED A

WATERSHED. MANY "ARABISTS"

SAID THAT THE U.S COULD

**NEVER DEPLOY FORCES TO AN** ARAB COUNTRY, THAT ARAB STATES COULD NEVER AFFORD OPEN ALLIANCE WITH THE US. **BUT THE LIBERATION OF KUWAIT** WAS A COALITION EFFORT, WHICH INCLUDED MANY ARAB STATES. THE COALITION DID NOT INCLUDE JORDAN OR THE PLO. THE PLO PICKED THE

LOSING SIDE AND, AS A DIRECT RESULT OF THE DEFEAT OF IRAQ, LOST ITS FINANCIAL **BACKING FROM ARAB** SUPPORTERS AND PARTICIPANTS IN DESERT STORM. AT THE SAME TIME, THE CREDIBILITY OF THE U.S. IN THE MIDDLE EAST WAS NEVER HIGHER.

PRESIDENT BUSH

UNDERSTOOD THIS WHEN HE

LAUNCHED A MIDDLE EAST

PEACE INITIATIVE IN MARCH

1991, WHICH LED TO THE

MADRID PEACE CONFERENCE

LATER IN THE YEAR.

THE PLO WAS ALSO ON THE LOSING SIDE OF THE COLD WAR -- ONLY MONTHS AFTER

DESERT STORM CAME THE END OF THE SOVIET UNION. THE PLO STOOD VIRTUALLY ALONE, ISOLATED, WITH A REAL CASH FLOW PROBLEM. AS A RESULT, PEACE NEVER LOOKED SO ATTRACTIVE TO ARAFAT. WISELY, THE CLINTON **ADMINISTRATION CONTINUED** THE MADRID PROCESS AND

STAYED OUT OF THE WAY OF
THE DIRECT ISRAELIPALESTINIAN TALKS IN NORWAY
WHICH LED TO THE
BREAKTHROUGH.

A SECOND CRITICAL

FACTOR WHICH MADE PEACE

POSSIBLE IS THE LONG-TERM

AMERICAN SUPPORT FOR

ISRAEL.

ONLY A SECURE ISRAEL --CONFIDENT OF CONTINUED AND STRONG U.S. SUPPORT -- COULD MAKE THE KIND OF **CONCESSIONS THAT LED TO THE** WHITE HOUSE HANDSHAKE. THIS TREND HAS CONTINUED AS THE DEMANDS ON OUR FOREIGN ASSISTANCE BUDGET CONTINUE TO

INCREASE. JUST LAST MONTH, THE SENATE PASSED A FOREIGN AID APPROPRIATIONS BILL WITH TWO AND ONE-HALF BILLION DOLLARS FOR THE FORMER SOVIET UNION, WHILE MAINTAINING PREVIOUS AID LEVELS TO ISRAEL AND EGYPT. THIS WAS POSSIBLE ONLY BY "RAIDING" THE DEFENSE

DEPARTMENT FOR MORE THAN \$1.5 BILLION. RESOURCES ARE TIGHT AND FOREIGN AID IS NOT POPULAR -- IN KANSAS OR ANYWHERE ELSE. THE CLINTON **ADMINISTRATION IS STILL ENGAGED IN A EXTENSIVE** REVIEW OF U.S. FOREIGN AID WHICH WILL GENERATE PROPOSALS FOR AN AID

PROGRAM WHICH REFLECTS
THE GLOBAL CHANGES OF THE
LAST FEW YEARS, AS WELL AS
CURRENT BUDGET
CONSTRAINTS.

THE DAY AFTER PRIME

MINISTER RABIN AND CHAIRMAN

ARAFAT SHOOK HANDS,

MAJORITY LEADER MITCHELL

AND I CO-HOSTED A MEETING

WITH YASSER ARAFAT. I NEVER
THOUGH I WOULD SEE THE DAY
WHEN ARAFAT WOULD SIT IN
THE U.S. CAPITOL AND

INTERNATIONAL "DONORS
CONFERENCE" EARLIER THIS
MONTH. OVER 40 NATION

PLEDGED ROUGHLY \$2 BILLION OVER THE NEXT FIVE YEARS. THE U.S. SHARE WILL BE \$500 **MILLION OVER FIVE YEARS IN GRANT AID AND GUARANTEES** FROM THE OVERSEAS PRIVATE INVESTMENT CORPORATION. WE CAN DO THIS WITH EXISTING RESOURCES IN OUR FOREIGN AID BUDGET.

IT IS LITTLE KNOWN THAT THE U.S. HAS BEEN PROVIDING **MODEST AMOUNTS OF HUMANITARIAN AID IN THE WEST BANK AND GAZA SINCE 1975.** THERE IS A SMALL ADDITIONAL **AMOUNT (\$25 MILLION) IN THE** CURRENT LAW RIGHT NOW. RESPONDING TO THE FORMER SOVIET UNION AND THE ISRAELI-

PLO PEACE THIS YEAR SHOWS
WE CAN FUND NEW RECIPIENTS
WITHOUT ABANDONING OLD
COMMITMENTS.
