

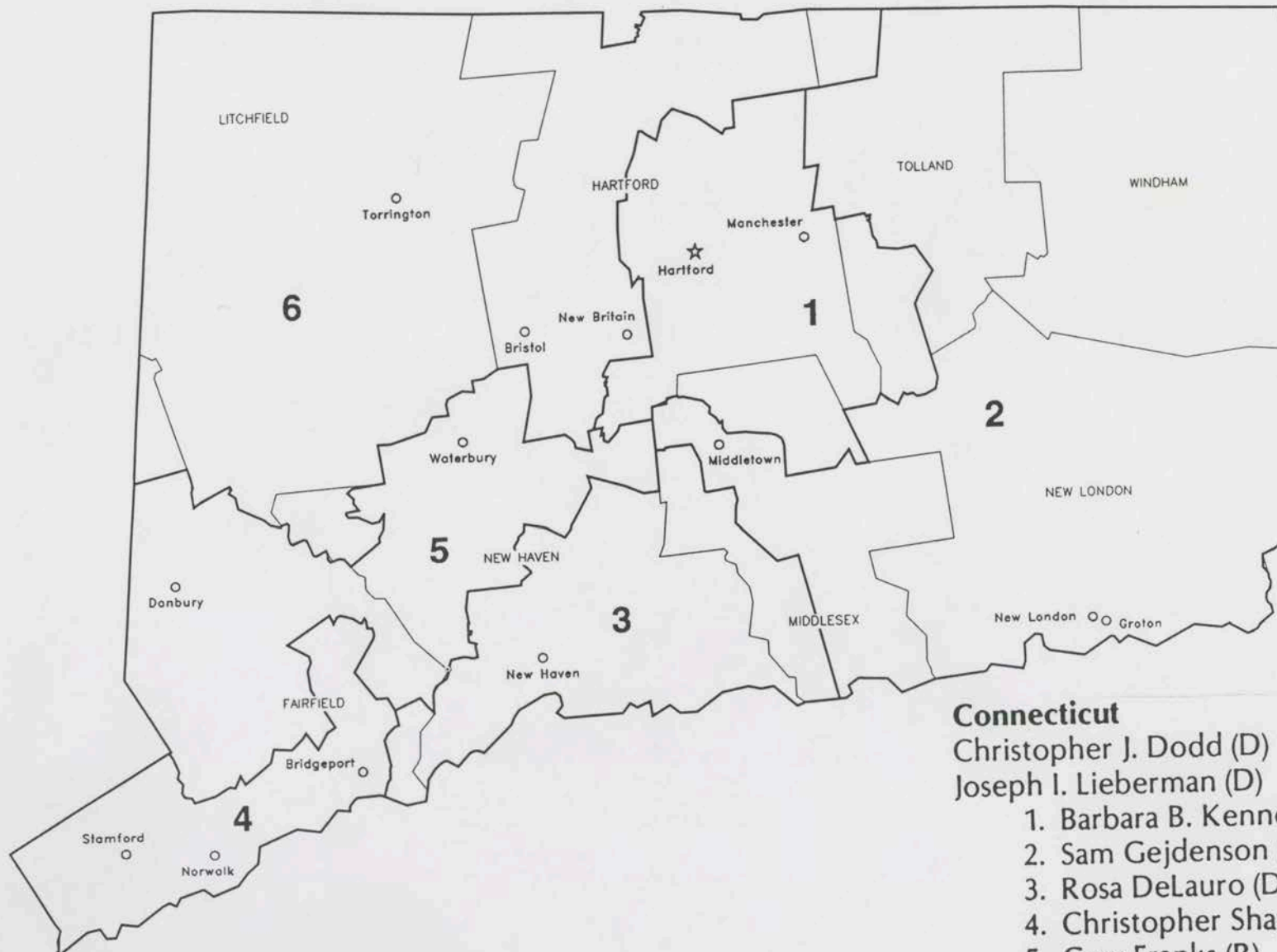

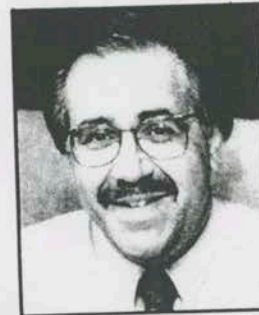

## MEMORADUM

### POLITICAL ENVIRONMENT

Though incumbent Senator Joseph Lieberman's poll numbers are good, the political environment in Connecticut has been very volatile due to Gov. Lowell Weicker's income tax in 1991. In addition, the Clinton Administration's new rise in broad-based taxes may re-ignite the anti-incumbent fever in Connecticut by reminding voters of Weicker's taxes. If this sentiment turns anti-Democrat, Lieberman may be in trouble; indeed, he encountered much opposition to his vote for the Clinton budget. State GOP Chairman John Mastropietro has strong feelings that taxes will be the "center stage" issue in 1994 and that Lieberman can be beaten.

Gross is the former editor of *Book Digest* magazine and an experienced reporter who covered Washington for many years. His latest book, *A Call for Revolution*, is currently on the *New York Times* bestseller list.

\*14 CONNECTICUT: BLUMENTHAL OUT FOR GOOD

AG Richard Blumenthal (D) said 12/8 he would not run. "Actually, Blumenthal said five months ago that he wasn't running ... but supporters were starting to hope he might change his mind." Comptroller Wm Curry (D): "To say the least, Dick would have been a formidable candidate." Blumenthal issued a statement "saying, in effect, that he absolutely, positively is not running for governor." Blumenthal, who has four children, including a newborn: "My family comes first." Speculation about Blumenthal's "intentions has been, at the least, a distraction as the field" has taken shape. "Some activists and contributors were waiting to see what Blumenthal did." Sen. Pres. John Larson (D): "I was a candidate regardless of who was in the race. ... In terms of the delegates it does free up a lot of people who might otherwise have waited to see whether he got in." State Sen. Richard Balducci (D): "I think he did that to give all the candidates a chance to go out and raise money. I appreciate it." Blumenthal's absence "may encourage others who have been thinking about running." Bridgeport Mayor Joseph Ganim (D) said 12/8 that his is "taking a good hard look at it." Ex-Rep. John Rowland (R), who is considering the race: "We weren't afraid of Blumenthal." Rowland "acknowledged that Blumenthal was seen as stronger than the other Democrats" (Ewing, HARTFORD COURANT, 12/9). Also running: LG Eunice Goark (I). Possibles: Businessman Joel Schiavone (R) and Sec/State Pauline Kezer (R).
