ERIE COUNTY POLITICAL BRIEFING

With 100,000 more Democrats than Republicans Erie County should be one of the state's Democratic strongholds. The county seat, Buffalo, is the most predominantly Democratic area of the county. The population of Buffalo is more than 300,000, and its voters are registered Democrat by better than 3 to 1.

However, thanks to its strength in the suburbs, Erie County Republicans controlled most major countywide offices - County Executive, Comptroller, Sheriff and District Attorney - up until a few years ago. All but the comptroller were since lost, with the Republicans finally losing the office of County Executive in 1987.

In the past three years, the Erie County Republican Committee has enjoyed a steady rebirth. In 1991, the party won its first county-wide contest in more than four years with Sharon Townsend's victory for Erie County Family Court Judge.

In that same year, Republican candidates upset two Democratic-incumbent County Legislators, whittling the Democrats majority in that house to a scant 9-8 edge. (The legislature now stands at 10-7, after a liberal Republican switched parties late in 1993.)

A year later, Republicans enjoyed even more upsets. Hamburg Supervisor Jack Quinn upset current-County Executive Dennis Gorski for a seat in the United States Congress (that seat had belonged to now-retired Congressman Henry Nowak) in a better than 2-1 Democratic district. Quinn has since earned a great deal of respect for his work in Congress, and, according to Roll Call, went from first to seventh in the list of seats targeted by the Democratic National Congressional Committee (Quinn will be in attendance at the event).

Also that year, Party Chairman Tom Reynolds was widely credited by Democrats and Republicans alike with helping to craft New York state's Congressional Reapportionment. Congressman Bill Paxon was perceived as a prime target in a Congressional remap, but his seat was saved. Paxon has since become chairman of the NRCC (Paxon will be in attendance at the event).

Again in 1992, Sen. Alfonse M. D'Amato virtually split heavily Democratic Erie County with Bob Abrams - a key to his successful re-election bid.

This past year, Republicans won the county's marquee contest: the race for Erie County Comptroller. Buffalo businesswoman Nancy Naples (who will be in attendance at the event), won a large, upset victory over her Democratic challenger, despite the enrollment disadvantage and running without Conservative party support (New York Election Law allows candidates to run with more than one major party line).

Republicans also won their first City Council seat in 12 years in the Buffalo's University District. Kevin Helfer is the Republican council member.

The party also won a second, county-wide race in Jan Rosa's bid for Family Court (she will be in attendance at the event). After cross-filing in the Democratic primary, she won the Democratic primary and her own Republican primary.

Next year, Erie County is expected to be a major battle ground in the gubernatorial race. Like Sen. D'Amato in 1992, it will be pivotal for any Republican candidate to split the heavily-Democratic county.

In 1995, Republicans are in a great position to reclaim the office of Erie County Executive. Incumbent Democrat Dennis Gorski is considered extremely vulnerable by both sides of the aisle.

Party Chairman Tom Reynolds, who is also a Member of the New York State Assembly, and the Assembly's Deputy Minority Leader, has been at the party helm since March of 1990. A return to the grassroots, strong candidate recruitment, outstanding fund-raising skills and ongoing party building have been the hallmarks of his administrations, and widely credited for the party's recent successes.

TALKING POINTS

No one can visit Buffalo without mentioning the three-time defending AFC Champion Buffalo Bills. This is a huge football town, and it looks like we may be headed to another Super Bowl.

Many of those in attendance will also be going on to the Roswell Park Cancer Institute's fund-raiser. Roswell Park is one of the premiere institutes of its kind in the United States, and a recent U.S. News and World Report survey of America's best hospitals, Roswell Park was ranked in the top three percent. Roswell ranked ahead of such world renown facilities as the Cleveland Clinic, Harvard's Massachusetts Hospital, Mount Sinai and the Cornell Medical Center.

The city is heavily focused on developing its waterfront, and has made great strides in that area. (A waterfront planning commission is stalled, to say it as flatteringly as possible, but looks toward an ambitious revitalization, similar to that experienced in Baltimore).

Buffalo is also home to the National Hockey League's Buffalo Sabres, who are currently planning construction of a new facility, the Crossroads Arena. Similarly, Pilot Field, home to the Triple-A baseball Buffalo Bisons won high marks for its construction in 1989, and is often referred to as the Jewel of Downtown Buffalo.

You are scheduled to receive the Gilda Radner Courage Award at the Roswell Park Cancer Institute on the evening of January 8.

The audience will consist of many doctors as well as business and community leaders, corporate sponsors, their guests and clients.

This is a black tie event, with about 900 guests expected. The purpose is to raise money for cancer research and care. This is the fourth annual dinner -- this year it is a circus theme. During the cocktail hour, the guests can play carnival games or win prizes at various booths.

Following the cocktail hour there will be a formal dinner. It will begin with the National Anthem, followed by a welcome from the Chairwoman of the event, Judy Molenberg. They will then present you with the award. There will be a podium and microphone. They would like you to make brief acceptance remarks. They will then introduce you to Dr. Chu, the developer of the P.S.A. test.

After dinner, two more awards will be given: one to David Campbell, President of Computer Task Group, a Fortune 500 company. He is a volunteer who secured a \$241 million bond issue from the State of N.Y. to be used to build a new hospital at Roswell Park in the next four years. This project is called, "Major Modernization". Mr. Campbell will receive the "Inspiration Award".

The second award, the "Hope Award", will be given to Dr. Vern Chapman, a scientist who has done significant work in genetic research for a cancer cure.

Gilda Radner died of ovarian cancer. During her illness, she dedicated herself to educating others on the symptoms of ovarian cancer. She is credited with saving hundreds of lives through this crusade.

The Gilda Radner Courage Award honors an individual who has taken his battle with cancer and has used it to inspire and motivate others. The people at Roswell Park believe that you have been a true inspiration to others and that your efforts to spread the word about early detection have also saved the lives of many.

All Star Night '94

Remarks for Dr. Piver and Donna Gioia

Dr. Piver:

IT IS INDEED A PLEASURE TO PRESENT THE THIRD ANNUAL GILDA RADNER COURAGE AWARD THIS EVENING. THE AWARD IS NAMED FOR A WOMAN WHO WAGED A COURAGEOUS PUBLIC BATTLE WITH CANCER, AND IN DOING SO, HEIGHTENED AWARENESS ABOUT THE DISEASE. SHE TOOK A VERY PERSONAL MATTER, LIKE HER CANCER, AND ALLOWED PEOPLE TO LEARN FROM IT. AND BECAUSE SHE DID, THOUSANDS OF WOMEN ACROSS THE COUNTRY HAVE BEEN PROMPTED TO SEEK EARLY MEDICAL INTERVENTION FOR GYNECOLOGIC CANCER AND HAVE ADDED THEIR NAMES TO THE GROWING NUMBER OF PEOPLE ON THE GILDA RADNER FAMILIAL OVARIAN REGISTRY, HOUSED AT ROSWELL PARK.

GENE WILDER CAME TO UNDERSTAND HOW COURAGEOUS HIS WIFE WAS AND HONORED HER MEMORY BY ALSO SPEAKING OUT, "TO PREVENT MORE GILDA'S FROM DEVELOPING THE SILENT KILLER, KNOWN AS OVARIAN CANCER."

HE ONCE SAID, "I USED TO THINK THAT GILDA WAS THE BIGGEST BABY IN THE WORLD. EVEN AFTER SHE GOT CANCER, I THOUGHT SHE WAS A BABY. THREE WEEKS BEFORE SHE DIED, WHEN SHE WILLED HERSELF OUT OF BED TO RECORD THE AUDIOCASSETTES OF HER BOOK, IT'S ALWAYS SOMETHING, THE THOUGHT OCCURRED TO ME, FOR THE FIRST TIME, THAT SHE MIGHT DIE. SHE DIED ON MAY 20, 1989. SOMETIME IN JUNE - I FORGET THE EXACT DATE - BUT IT WAS WARM AND SUNNY AND THE FLOWERS WERE IN FULL BLOOM - I REALIZED THAT SHE WAS THE BRAVEST WOMAN I HAD EVER KNOWN."

DONNA GIOIA:

TODAY WE ARE HONORING A MAN WHO, THROUGHOUT HIS LIFE, HAS DEMONSTRATED EXCEPTIONAL PERSONAL COURAGE, BE IT IN THE POLITICAL ARENA OR ON THE BATTLEFIELD. DURING WORLD WAR II, SENATOR DOLE SERVED AS A PLATOON LEADER AND REGRETTABLY LOST USE OF HIS RIGHT ARM WHEN IT WAS SHATTERED BY SHRAPNEL. HE SUBSEQUENTLY WAS AWARDED TWO BRONZE STARS WITH TWO CLUSTERS FOR HIS BATTLEFIELD EXPERIENCES. MORE RECENTLY, THE SENATOR HAS DEMONSTRATED PERSONAL COURAGE BY HIS WILLINGNESS TO DISCUSS HIS PROSTATE CANCER, A TOPIC THAT PREVIOUSLY GENERATED LITTLE DISCUSSION BY MEN IN GENERAL, ESPECIALLY THOSE OF HIS STATURE. IN FACT, SINCE HIS CANCER WAS DETECTED IN 1991, SENATOR DOLE HAS WAGED A PERSONAL CAMPAIGN TO INCREASE PUBLIC AWARENESS ABOUT PROSTATE CANCER AND THE BENEFIT OF EARLY DETECTION AND TREATMENT.

SENATOR DOLE, BECAUSE YOU, LIKE GILDA RADNER, HAD THE COURAGE TO ALLOW OTHERS TO LEARN FROM YOUR PERSONAL EXPERIENCE, AND BECAUSE YOUR OPENNESS HAS BOTH INSPIRED AND SET AN EXAMPLE FOR OTHER CANCER VICTIMS IN THIS COUNTRY, IT IS OUR GREAT PLEASURE TO PRESENT YOU WITH THE GILDA RADNER COURAGE AWARD.

PSA ALLOWED FOR EARLY DETECTION OF YOUR CANCER AND FOR ITS SUCCESSFUL TREATMENT. IT IS NOW MY PLEASURE TO INTRODUCE YOU TO THE ROSWELL PARK SCIENTIST WHO DEVELOPED THE PSA BLOOD TEST, DR. T. MING CHU.

"Offering a blueprint for the state that could well serve as a tidy campaign platform," Gov. Mario Cuomo (D) called for building a "future of hope" by cracking down on crime, cutting taxes and making it "tougher" to go on welfare (Finnegan, N.Y. DAILY NEWS, 1/6). "For years, the State of the State Message was listened to as closely for hints" of Cuomo's nat'l ambitions as for the "actual content of the words. This year ... legislators, lobbyists and reporters simply tried to mine from [the] speech whether he planned to run for a fourth term" (Fisher, N.Y. TIMES, 1/6). N.Y. POST screamer: "Gov sounds like a candidate Ready To Run" (1/6). "Cuomo's speech was a skillful, if somewhat forced, effort to put the state's prostrate economy and high unemployment in as good a light as possible." The speech was a "well-crafted political document confronting the four major concerns -- crime, tax cuts, the economy and welfare -- that ... are on the minds of New York voters" (Dicker, N.Y. POST, 1/6).

MARIO, THE NEW DEMOCRAT? By calling for tax cuts, a "crackdown on crime and a welfare program that emphasizes work," Cuomo, once the "darling of liberal Democrats, sought ... to outflank the Republicans" (Sack, N.Y. TIMES, 1/6). He "entered a new election season ... sounding distinctly in tune with his times" (Goldberg, N.Y. NEWSDAY, 1/6). N.Y. DAILY NEWS editorial: "Yes, that was Mario Cuomo delivering his 12th State of the State address ... without once mentioning the Family of New York. ... For survival purposes, it's surely wiser to be a New Democrat than it is to continue a New Dealer. Second, while the governor's proposals are welcome, each only goes so far -- and that's not far enough" (1/6).
