SUBJECT: American-Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee Speech

I spoke with President Albert Mokhibar today about your remarks tomorrow evening to the Arab-American Anti-Discrimination Committee (ADC). There will be up to 300 people present for the buffet dinner starting at 6:30. Congressmen confirmed are Rahall (D-WV), Penny (D-MN), Danner (D-MO), and Knollenberg (R-MI). They expect only brief remarks; whether you want to take questions is up to you. The format will be for speakers to walk to the podium as they arrive, make remarks, and depart.

Issues Albert suggested be addressed include: Lebanon travel ban, peace process including the violence, and hate crimes including the murder of Alex Odeh. I have drafted the attached talking points which can be put on index cards if acceptable.




