THIS IS AN OLD DRAWBRIDGE BUILT IN THE 1950'S THAT IS CONSIDERED A HAZARD TO NAVIGATION IN THE BRUNSWICK AREA. IT SPANS A RIVER ON THE INLAND PORTION OF THE BRUNSWICK AREA.

COVERDELL'S PEOPLE HAVE BEEN TRYING TO GET THE BRIDGE REPLACED UNDER THE COAST GUARD'S "TRUMAN-HOBBS" PROGRAM TO REPLACE HAZARDS TO NAVIGATION. THEY HAD RECEIVED SEVERAL MILLION DOLLARS OVER THE LAST THREE YEARS TO DO DESIGN WORK AND GRADING WORK LEADING UP TO THE STRUCTURE. THIS IS A \$100 MILLION-PLUS PROJECT.

CONGRESSMAN BOB CARR GAVE THEM LAST YEAR'S \$6 MILLION APPROPRIATION WITH THE UNDERSTANDING IT WOULD BE THE LAST YEAR THEY WOULD REQUEST IT UNDER TRUMAN-HOBBS BECAUSE HE FELT THERE WAS MONEY UNDER THE HIGHWAY PROGRAM FOR BRIDGE REPLACEMENT. REP. JACK KINGSTON - 1ST CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT

Those attending the reception and luncheon for Rep. Kingston are mainly business leaders and members of the Chamber of Commerce from McIntosh, Glynn and Camden Counties along the shoreline.

The first district covers all of Georgia's Atlantic coast and goes about 100 miles inland. Democrats held this seat from Reconstruction to 1992 when Kingston won. However, it is a very conservative district. The Almanac of American Politics gives three reasons why Kingston won: 1) the moderate Democrat Rep. Lindsay Thomas retired; 2) redistricting removed Savannah's black population; and, 3) Kingston has been in the state legislature from Savannah since 1985 making him a strong candidate.

Rep. Kingston sits on the Agriculture and Merchant Marine Committees. At this time he faces no opposition from either party.

Besides the obvious issues of crime, health care, economy and trade, the following are also of concern to Rep. Kingston and those in the district and around the State:

- o Funding for the Sidney Lanier Bridge -- the bridge is quite old and in need of repairs. A ship hit it and 10 - 12 people were killed. Also, during times of emergency, such as hurricanes, the residents of Jekyll Island need a safe way to exit the island.
- o Possible base closures (they have 8-9 installations)
- o Kingston hopes to involve GA Southern University in developing agriculture-related businesses and increase the export of Georgia farm products
- o Other than agriculture, the largest employers are tourism, federal government, frozen seafood companies and timber related businesses
- o In '92, Georgia lost six House incumbents to retirement and election upsets. The ranking GA member, Rep. Roy Rowland (D), recently announced his retirement

- o Georgia has the largest number of Republican candidates qualifying for office than ever before
- o Redistricting of CD-11 -- A panel of three judges ruled on 4/20 that they would not delay the qualifying period for the district (4/25-29). However, they did warn that the lawsuit challenging its constitutionality has a "likelihood" of winning. The trial date is set for 7/18, one day before the 7/19 primary, and will address the "merits" of the lawsuit. The plaintiffs of the suit claim that the 11th CD is an example of "racial gerrymandering."
- o AG Mike Bowers, switched from Democrat to Republican on 4/5. A letter from you was sent congratulating him (see enclosed).
- o 1996 Olympics

SUBJECT: BASE CLOSURE ISSUES IN GEORGIA

Georgia has a number of bases at risk -- 7 to 9. The same issues of budget and too-rapid defense draw-down apply. The assumption that Nunn will protect them is eroding rapidly.

The two year slip in base closure would be a popular theme. Pressure needs to be put on Nunn who is cool to the idea. There is a bill in the House to do this -- Spence/Hanson.

Bases at risk in Georgia include: Warner Robbins Air Force Base, (Marietta), Moody Air Force Base (taken off the '91 list by the commission), Ft. Stewart, (Atlanta), and others.

There is also a question about whether the Trident submarine bases, currently located at Bangor, WA and Kings Bay, GA will be consolidated into one -- it is unclear which one it might be.

There is no base that would devastate the state economy, however the local impacts could be severe. installations are at risk.

TALKING POINTS

-- The fact is, we have not yet realized any savings from even the first base closure process which was completed in 1988. It will be 1996 before any savings are seen from that very first round. I don't see the hurry.

-- There are several good reasons to take a couple of years to reconsider this process.

First, we simply don't have the money. It will cost \$5 to \$7 billion to do another round of base closures in '95. Defense dollars are too scarce as it is. We simply don't have the money.

It seems to me that we should digest the high costs of the first three rounds before we bite off another chunk. Even the most optimistic figures show it takes at least 6 years to realize any savings whatsoever.

It doesn't make sense to take away from legitimate defense needs to pay to close bases we end up needing. The world is still a dangerous place, perhaps more so, now.

-- In '95, the Administration is seeking to double the number of bases closed over the last three rounds put together. The point is, they are trying to hit a budget target, not trying to ensure our national security.

Congressman Kingston is on the House Ag Committee. He is viewed on the committee as a solid trooper who is cautious and follows Pat Roberts lead when needed. Attached is a brief summary of Kingston's district and some important issues.

PRIVATE PROPERTY RIGHTS...Wetlands are a big issue in Georgia. On the Senate side, you have introduced the Private Property Rights Act of 1994--S. 2006. This bill requires agencies to conduct a Takings Impact Assessment when promulgating regulations. Your approach has been to force a vote on this in the Senate during consideration of the Safe Drinking Water Act.

PEANUTS...Under the Uruguay Round agreement, the U.S. will reduce imports of peanut butter while providing increased access for edible peanut imports.

Section 22 import quotas for peanuts will be replaced by high ad valorem tariffs, which will be reduced by the minimum 15% in equal annual installments over 6 years, beginning in 1995.

U.S. producers will likely gain, according to the ag department, because the net effect is expected to be lower peanut-equivalent imports compared to baseline projections of imports without the Uruguay Round.

COTTON...The Georgia cotton crop disappeared because of the boll weevil. However, it has made a come back in the last 5-6 years.

The principal impact of the Uruguay Round on cotton, according USDA, will be that higher world incomes will generate higher world consumption of cotton and textiles and apparel.

The U.S. is expected to increase cotton production as increased world demand for U.S. cotton exports more than offsets a decrease in U.S. mill use caused by more textile and apparel imports.

Elimination of Section 22 import quotas for cotton will have almost no effect on U.S. raw cotton imports, according to USDA, because transportation costs are too high for foreign cotton to be competitive in the U.S. market.

Clean Water Act -- Again, standards must be science-based and should not be adopted without supporting comparative risk/benefit analysis to justify them. In the section 404 wetlands area, Kingston supports approach similar to Mr. Tauzin's which would (1) help protect (or require mitigation for loss) those "wetlands" which are truly significant, and release those which are not of significant importance; (2) require compensation for "takings" of private property value; and (3) simplify and streamline the permitting process for landowners.

Health Care:

Jack does not support employer mandates, creation of new bureaucracies, or an increase in taxes to pay for health care. He supports elimination of pre-existing conditions, portability of insurance, malpractice reform, allowing businesses to form voluntary purchasing pools, administrative simplifications, 100% deductibility for the self-employed and disclosure of physician and hospital fees. He is a cosponsor of H.R. 3080, the Michel plan and the Rowland/Bilirakis plan.

Crime:

Subject: Sidney Lanier Bridge Replacement Project

In 1972, ten people were killed when a ship struck the Sidney Lanier Bridge. The same bridge was struck in 1987. Although no deaths resulted directly, one worker lost his life during reconstruction of the bridge.

The Port of Brunswick is located in Glynn County, Georgia. Brunswick Port is one of the two primary seaports within the state. The Sidney Lanier Bridge, constructed in 1951, spans the entrance to the Port of Brunswick's harbor.

Congress designated this bridge a hazard to navigation in the 1990 Coast Guard Omnibus Act and called for its removal. Under provisions of the Truman-Hobbs Act, Georgia has received \$11,900,000 in Federal appropriations to begin removal and replacement of the Bridge.

In 1993, members of the House Transportation Appropriations Subcommittee declared that Truman-Hobbs would only be used for rail bridges. Because of this directive, bridges such as the Sidney Lanier Bridge, no longer qualify for Federal funds for removal and replacement under the Truman-Hobbs Act.

To advance the replacement of the Sidney Lanier Bridge, Georgia is seeking special authorization under the Intermodal Surface Transportation and Efficiency Act (ISTEA) through the National Highway System bill.

Total costs for removing and replacing the Sidney Lanier Bridge are \$94,820,000. From previous Truman-Hobbs appropriations and state matching funds, an unfunded balance of \$82,920,000 remains.
