THANK YOU. AS I STAND HERE IN THE MEYERHOFF THEATER, I RECALL THE PERSONAL TOUR THROUGH THIS REMARKABLE MUSEUM THAT **ELIZABETH AND I WERE** PRIVILEGED TO RECEIVE FROM BUD MEYERHOFF.

LIKE ALL THOSE WHO VISIT HERE, ELIZABETH AND I WERE OVERWHELMED BY WHAT IS TRULY THE MOST TRAGIC AND HORRIFYING STORY OF OUR TIME. AND WE AGREED THAT IT IS A STORY THAT MUST BE PRESERVED AND RETOLD SO THAT FUTURE GENERATIONS WILL "NEVER FORGET."
