I ALSO BRING GREETINGS THIS MORNING FROM MY WIFE, WHO IS PROUD TO HEAD AN ORGANIZATION THAT-AS DICK SCHUBERT KNOWS-**DEPENDS UPON AN ARMY OF MORE** THAN TWO MILLION VOLUNTEERS. **ACTUALLY, YOU SHOULD BE GLAD** THAT I'M HERE INSTEAD OF ELIZABETH.

WHEN I SPEAK, THERE ARE ALWAYS SOME PEOPLE IN THE AUDIENCE WHO SAY "HE'S JUST A POLITICIAN, HE'S PROBABLY AFTER MY MONEY." WELL. WHEN ELIZABETH SPEAKS ON BEHALF OF THE RED CROSS--THERE'S USUALLY NO TWO WAYS ABOUT IT. SHE IS AFTER YOUR MONEY..AND SHE'S ALSO AFTER YOUR BLOOD.

I'M REMINDED THIS MORNING OF THE STORY OF THE BUSINESSWOMAN WHO WAS ELECTED CHAIR OF HER LOCAL CHARITY. AFTER LOOKING AT THE RECORDS, SHE WAS APPALLED AT AN **OBVIOUS OVERSIGHT. A TOWN LEADER** WITH A SIX-FIGURE INCOME HAD NEVER GIVEN A PENNY. SHE CALLED ON THE MAN AND TOLD HIM WHAT THE RECORDS SHOWED.

AND THE MAN SAID, "DO YOUR RECORDS ALSO SHOW THAT MY **BROTHER WAS INJURED IN AN AUTOMOBILE ACCIDENT, AND WILL NEVER BE ABLE TO SUPPORT HIMSELF?** DO YOUR RECORDS SHOW THAT MY SISTER WAS WIDOWED WITH SEVERAL CHILDREN, AND THERE WAS NO INSURANCE, NO MEANS OF SUBSISTENCE?"

TAKEN ABACK, THE NEW
CHAIRWOMAN FLUSHED, STARED AT HER
SHOES, AND SAID SOFTLY, "NO, THE
RECORDS DON'T SHOW THAT."

"WELL," THE TOWN LEADER SAID,
"IF I DON'T GIVE ANYTHING TO THEM,

HAS NEVER BEEN STRONGER THAN TODAY.

AND NO DOUBT ABOUT IT, WE

NEED EACH AND EVERY VOLUNTEER OUT

THERE-AND MANY, MANY MORE. FOR

WE ALL KNOW THAT AMERICA FACES

SOME VERY CHALLENGING TIMES.

OUR INNER CITIES HAVE BECOME

ZONES OF TERROR, AND THERE ARE EVEN

GANGS AND DRIVE BY SHOOTINGS IN

COMMUNITIES IN KANSAS.

THIRTY YEARS AGO, TEACHERS
LISTED CHEWING GUM IN CLASS AND

SOME TEENAGERS WHO WERE ARRESTED
FOR ATTACKING A WOMAN. AND WHEN
THE MOTHER OF ONE OF THOSE
ARRESTED WAS ASKED IF HER SON WAS
A GOOD BOY, SHE REPLIED, "THERE ARE
NO GOOD BOYS ANYMORE."

"THERE ARE NO GOOD BOYS

ANYMORE." I BELIEVE THAT IS A BIT OF

AN OVERSTATEMENT-BUT THE SAD FACT

WORDS RING TRUE.

THERE IS A GREAT DEAL OF TALK
IN THIS TOWN ABOUT HEALTH CARE
REFORM...AND THAT'S GOOD, BECAUSE
OUR COUNTRY HAS THE BEST HEALTH
CARE SYSTEM IN THE WORLD, AND WE
NEED TO KEEP IT THAT WAY.

BUT I AM ALSO GLAD THAT THERE
HAS BEEN MORE AND MORE DISCUSSION

ABOUT THE MORAL HEALTH OF OUR

NATION...JUST LAST WEEK, THE COVER

STORY IN NEWSWEEK WAS ABOUT THE

SEARCH FOR VALUES AND VIRTUE.

AND I'M ONE OF THOSE WHO
HAPPENS TO BELIEVE THAT IF AMERICA
IS TO SUCCEED IN THE NEXT CENTURY,
THEN WE HAVE TO RETURN TO SOME OF
THE VALUES THAT WERE THE HALLMARK
OF MUCH OF THIS CENTURY...VALUES

LIKE FAMILY. CIVILITY. DECENCY.

PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY. INDIVIDUAL

INITIATIVE. GENEROSITY TOWARD

OTHERS.

THESE WERE VALUES THAT WERE
SHARED THROUGHOUT NEIGHBORHOODS,
AND THROUGHOUT COMMUNITIES-AND
WHENEVER SOMEONE SAW A KID WHO
WAS ABOUT TO STEP OVER THE LINETHEY STEPPED IN-EVEN IF IT WASN'T

YES, I KNOW THINGS WEREN'T PERFECT THEN, AND SOCIETY CERTAINLY HAD ITS PROBLEMS. BUT WHAT WE DIDN'T HAVE WAS 12 YEAR OLD GANG MEMBERS, 14 YEAR OLD DRUG ADDICTS, 16 YEAR OLD UNWED MOTHERS, AND 18 YEAR OLDS GRADUATING FROM HIGH SCHOOL UNABLE TO READ THEIR DIPLOMA.

BUT SOMEHOW, SOMEWHERE ALONG THE WAY, TOO MANY OF US STOPPED STEPPING IN TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE...TOO MANY OF US **ACCEPTED THE CLAIMS OF THOSE WHO** SAID THAT OUR VALUES WERE OLD FASHIONED OR OUTMODED. WE DIDN'T **BECOME BAD NEIGHBORS...WE BECAME** INDIFFERENT ONES...AND AMERICA SUFFERED FOR IT.

AS CAN BE SEEN IN THIS ROOM, HOWEVER, I BELIEVE THE TIDE IS TURNING. MORE AND MORE AMERICANS ARE FINDING THE COURAGE TO SAY THAT THERE IS A "RIGHT AND WRONG," AND NOT JUST SOME SLIDING SCALE OF BEHAVIOR THAT CAN BE ADJUSTED TO FIT WHATEVER IS CONVENIENT AT THE MOMENT.

AND MORE AND MORE AMERICANS ARE FINDING THE TIME TO VOLUNTEER IN THE COUNTLESS NUMBER OF ORGANIZATIONS THAT MAKE A DIFFERENCE WITH OUR YOUTH-AND WITH OTHERS IN NEED OF A HELPING HAND. **DURING THE EARLY 1800'S, ALEXIS** DE TOQUEVILLE, THAT YOUNG FRENCHMAN WHO TOURED AMERICA,

DESCRIBED FOR HIS INCREDULOUS

COUNTRYMEN WHAT HE HAD SEEN HERE.

HE WROTE, WITH WONDER, THAT

IN AMERICA, WHEN A CITIZEN SAW A
PROBLEM THAT NEEDED SOLVING, HE
WOULD CROSS THE STREET AND TALK
TO A NEIGHBOR ABOUT IT. THE FIRST
THING YOU KNOW, A COMMITTEE WOULD
BE FORMED, AND BEFORE LONG THE
PROBLEM WOULD BE SOLVED. AND, HE

ADDED, "YOU MAY NOT BELIEVE THIS,

BUT NOT A SINGLE BUREAUCRAT WOULD

EVER HAVE BEEN INVOLVED."

LAST YEAR WE HAD A LITTLE
DISCUSSION ABOUT VOLUNTEERISM AND
ABOUT NATIONAL SERVICE LEGISLATION.
AND LET ME BE FRANK IN SAYING THAT
I OPPOSED THE BILL. I OPPOSED IT NOT
BECAUSE I OPPOSE VOLUNTEERISM OR
NATIONAL SERVICE-BUT I OPPOSED IT

BECAUSE ONCE THE FEDERAL
GOVERNMENT BECAME INVOLVED, THE
WHOLE NATURE OF VOLUNTEERISM
WOULD CHANGE.

I'M WILLING TO GIVE THE BILL A
CHANCE...BUT WHAT I'M NOT WILLING TO
DO IS CREATE A SYSTEM WHERE UNCLE
SAM SORTS THROUGH AMERICA'S
VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATIONS AND PICKS
WINNERS AND LOSERS.

JUST LAST WEEK, I WAS OVER IN **EUROPE FOR THE 50TH ANNIVERSARY** CELEBRATION OF D-DAY. AND PERHAPS D-DAY WAS THE ULTIMATE EXAMPLE OF THE AMERICAN VOLUNTEER SPIRIT. OUR SOLDIERS WENT TO EUROPE NOT TO GAIN TERRITORY FOR OUR COUNTRY. RATHER, COUNTLESS AMERICANS RISKED THEIR LIVES, AND COUNTLESS MORE

GAVE THEIR LIVES, SO THAT FREEDOM WOULD SURVIVE.

AND I REMEMBER WATCHING A D-DAY SPECIAL ON TELEVISION BEFORE I WENT TO EUROPE...AND ON ONE, THEY INTERVIEWED A FRENCH CITIZEN WHO LIVED THROUGH THE WAR, AND WHO TALKED ABOUT WHAT AMERICAN SOLDIERS DID. AND WITH TEARS IN HER

EYES, SHE SAID "FOR OUR TOMORROWS,
THEY GAVE THEIR TODAYS."

AS LONG AS PEOPLE LIKE YOU ARE WILLING TO GIVE AN HOUR OUR TWO OUT OF THEIR TODAYS, SO THAT OTHERS MIGHT HAVE A BRIGHTER TOMORROW, THEN I KNOW THAT FREEDOM WILL ALWAYS SURVIVE.
