Durable medical equipment consists of items such as wheelchairs, crutches, artificial limbs, catheters, etc. Under current law, Medicare reimburses for these items if they are ordered by a doctor. The group you are speaking to wants to make sure it stays that way.

There has been some talk during health care reform to save money by not reimbursing the medical equipment or to just group the expense of medical equipment with a doctor's bill or a hospital bill. This would be unacceptable to the manufacturers of the equipment. The Dole bill retains current law.
