### Political Climate:

The gubernatorial race in 1996 is beginning to shape up. State Auditor Margaret Kelly will probably run. 1992 Attorney General Candidate David Steelman (\$) will run. Other GOP possibilities include St. Sen Frank Flotron and St. Rep. Zane Yates.

Congressman Mel Hancock will term limit himself and retire. Former Sec. of State Roy Blunt will run and probably win that seat. In the ninth district, there is a good chance that Kenny Hulshof, 1994 candidate, will run and defeat Harold Volkmer (D) - if he doesn't retire first. There are rumblings in the fourth district against Ike Skelton (D). State "Senator No" Larry Rohrbach is mentioned as a potential candidate. Another possibility is newly elected St. Sen Bill Kenny. Bill lives in eastern Jackson County (KC) and is a former Chiefs quarterback. In northwest Missouri in the 6th district Pat Danner (D) may find herself in a race against St. Sen. Sam Graves. Sam's brother Todd was recently elected as Platte County Prosecutor. Todd will probably run for Attorney General someday. Keep your eye on the Graves boys in the future - they are on the move.

There are some harsh campaign finance laws recently enacted that I am not up to speed on.

As you may already know, most of the money and contributors live in Jim Talent's district - West St. Louis County. The 7th district in SW Missouri is a GOP voter rich district.

Missouri will be a swing state in 1996. If the state goes to the GOP nominee for President, then there might be a good shot at picking off Gov. Mel Carnahan (D), picking up 1 or 2 congressional seats and taking over a chamber in the state legislature. In 1993, Carnahan rammed through the largest tax increase in state history. This was after his 1992 campaign promise to put the tax increase to a vote of the people. This of course infuriated Mel Hancock, so he started his "Hancock II" campaign. This proposal would have retroactively repealed all tax increases that were not put to a vote of the people. Many people agreed with the spirit of the amendment. Unfortunately, the way it was written on the ballot tended to scare a lot more people. This proposal went down in flames on November 8. There is speculation that it galvanized the liberal democratic base in some areas of the state. If this is true, it probably affected Hulshof's chances against Harold Volkmer. The Univ of Mo and NE MO State are both in that district for example.

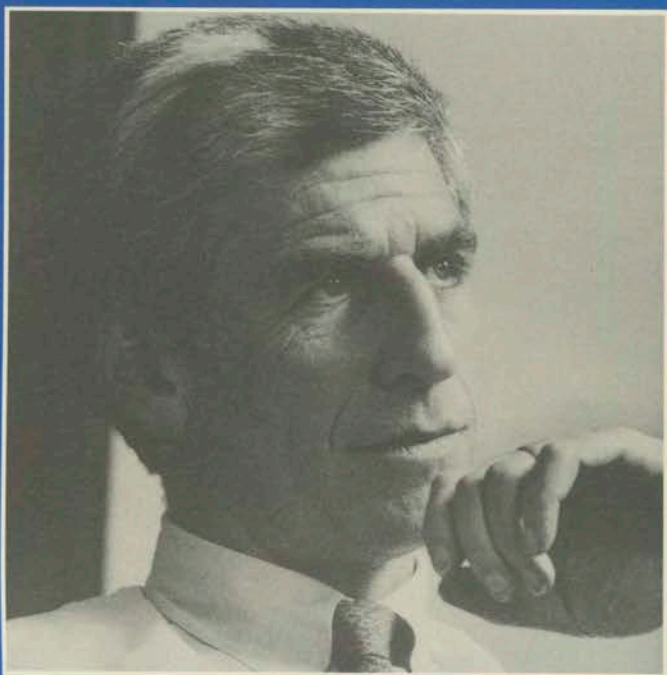

## THE HONORABLE JOHN C. DANFORTH

In his 18 years in the United States Senate, former Senator John C. Danforth of Missouri sponsored numerous legislative measures important to the state and nation. These included laws to encourage long-term economic growth; strengthen America's world trade policies; improve the protections of civil rights laws; increase production of affordable housing; and enhance transportation safety.

He served on three key committees of the Senate: Finance; Commerce, Science and Transportation; and the Select Committee on Intelligence. Danforth was the principal author and sponsor of the Civil Rights Act of 1991, one of the nation's basic statutes for fairness in hiring, promotion and other employment practices.

As a senior member of the Finance Committee, Danforth devoted significant attention to the U.S. tax policy and international trade policy. He introduced and supported legislation to encourage the production of affordable housing; to spur research and development; and to foster capital formation.

Danforth also was active in efforts to address health care costs; to improve education; to stimulate rural economic development; to encourage soil conservation; to increase federal support for basic scientific research;

and to reduce hunger and malnutrition throughout the world.

In Missouri politics and government, Danforth's service as State Attorney General and U.S. Senator served to help set high standards of effectiveness and accountability for government. He was elected Missouri Attorney General in 1968 – his first race for public office. This campaign was the first Republican victory in a statewide race in more than 20 years and began a period of reform and two-party politics in Missouri. He was re-elected Attorney General in 1972. He was elected to the Senate in 1976 and re-elected in 1982 and 1988.

Danforth was born in St. Louis on Sept. 5, 1936, and was raised in Clayton. He received his secondary education at St. Louis Country Day School and graduated with honors from Princeton University in 1958. In 1963, he received a Bachelor of Divinity degree from Yale Divinity School and a Bachelor of Laws degree from Yale Law School.

He and his wife, the former Sally Dobson of St. Louis, are the parents of five children, Eleanor, Mary, Dorothy, Johanna and Thomas. Danforth and Sally have moved into their new home in St. Louis County.
