CHURCHILL WAS VISITED BY A DELEGATION FROM THE **TEMPERANCE LEAGUE, AND** CHASTISED BY ONE WOMAN WHO

SAID, "MR. PRIME MINISTER, I'VE HEARD THAT IF ALL THE WHISKEY YOU HAVE DRUNK SINCE THE WAR BEGAN WERE POURED INTO THIS ROOM, IT WOULD COME ALL THE WAY UP TO YOUR WAIST."

AND IN THE DAYS AND MONTHS AHEAD, WE WILL CONTINUE TO CLIMB. AND WE ARE NOT GOING TO STOP UNTIL WE RETURN POWER, FREEDOM, AND OPPORTUNITY TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE.
