#### VII. BACKGROUND:

This is the first Trust meeting of 1995. The dinner is the first event of the meeting. Briefings will be given by Senators D'Amato, Smith, Craig, Simpson and McConnell the following day.

Senatorial Trust dues are \$10,000 per year in personal money only. In off-years, dues are paid directly to the Trust. In election years, members have the option of directing their dues to the Senate nominees of their choice. The purpose of the Trust is to ensure that Republican Senators and Senate candidates have the resources necessary to run a successful campaign. Trust members are responsible for generating over \$3 million per year to the NRSC and our Senate candidates.

There will be approximately 150 people in attendance at the dinner and reception.

During dinner, members and Senators will be seated in rounds of 10 (seating will be assigned). A mike and podium will be in the front of the room. Senator Dole's reserved seat will be at the table to the immediate right of the podium.

A photographer will be taking candid shots.
