NOW, USUALLY WHEN THE NEW YORK TIMES CRITICIZES ME, I KNOW I'M ON THE RIGHT TRACK. AND BELIEVE ME, FROM THE SUPPORTIVE COMMENTS I'VE RECEIVED, I KNOW THERE ARE COUNTLESS MOTHERS AND FATHERS ACROSS AMERICA WHO SHARE MY CONCERN.

THIS IS A FREE SOCIETY...AND CENSORSHIP IS NOT THE ANSWER THE COMPANIES THAT DISTRIBUTE THIS FILTH HAVE A RIGHT TO DO SO. BUT YOU AND I ALSO HAVE A RIGHT AND A DUTY TO LET THE **ENTERTAINMENT INDUSTRY KNOW** THAT THEY WILL BE HELD **ACCOUNTABLE FOR THEIR ACTIONS, FOR PUTTING PROFIT** AHEAD OF COMMON DECENCY.
