
Dear Bob:

In my Message to the Congress of March 25, 1971, I recommended that seven of the domestic Executive Departments and several independent agencies be replaced by four new departments organized around the basic purposes of the Government. On the same day four bills to establish the proposed departments, together with explanatory reports, were transmitted to the Congress.

Because of the importance of the reorganizations and the public interest they have generated, I have had the principal documents released on March 25 assembled in a single printed compilation, a copy of which I am sending you with this letter. You will find that it includes the text of my Message, the four bills, the section-by-section analyses, the explanatory reports, and various informative charts and listings. I hope that having all these documents together in one handy booklet will be of help to you in the months ahead as the Congress takes action on the legislation.

Once again, I strongly urge your support of this comprehensive effort to give our Government the structure it will need in order to cope successfully with the problems of the years ahead, and to restore confidence in the administration of the public business.
