I haven't much to write about but I thought I'd just find out how everyone is. It's really been snowing up here there is about 8 inches of snow on the ground now, and it will probably snow some more before the week is over.

I got to go to Kansas City Saturday with the basketball team even though I didn't get to play. Kansas was defeated 40 to 25 by the Gardner Navy Base. I had a lot of fun, while I was waiting for the train to take me back to Lawrence I saw Oscar Bill. He was just going home for a 7 day furlough. He doesn't know where he will go after his furlough ; but he figured that he would be sent to some trade school. I also saw Elizabeth Woelk, I don't know what her name is now but it used to be Woelk.

I wrote Gloria a letter last week and I should hear from her sometime soon.

You probably read in the Sunday paper that Roosevelt closed all enlistments into any branch of the armed forces which means unless my application for the air is still acceptable that I'll just have to wait until I'm drafted. I also received my questionnaire last Tuesday, which probably means that I'll get my second one as soon as I send this one back. The army is taking one of our boys at the end of this semester and he received his Questionnaire only about a week before I did. I have to see Mr. Lawrence Woodruff, who is in charge of all enlistments here at school, this afternoon sometime and if he says that I'm still eligibel to take the Air Corps test I can take it this week sometime. If I cannot pass the Air Corp mental test or the physical exam I can still get into Civilian Pilot Training, but there is no reserve in the C.P.T.

I may have to come this week-end to see how I stand with the draft board, I imagine that they will at least let me finish this semester of which there is only five more weeks. The semester ends January the 16.

I don't imagine there is much going on in Russell so I won't ask .

You might send down my cordurary's, I can use them in this kind of weather. Send me some more cheese too if you will. Well. that's about all I have to say so I'll stop writing and go over to see Mr. Woodruff now.
