in Kentucky. We have to do
8 weeks training there then
we are supposed to go to Camp
McCoy, Michigan to fire our



big guns, then we may
get to see a little action.

I haven't heard from Kenny
either he is either awfully
lucky or he has gone over. He'll
be O.K. though it will probably
be pretty hard to get accustomed
to things for a while. Keep
writing him though so he will
have mail when he gets to
his new station.
