could do for you but I guess
we can't do anything but keep
the mail coming to you.

I'm coming along fine
in school and sure do like
it. It keeps me pretty busy
studying everytime I get a
chance. The teachers are so
nice and all of the girls
are too.

Three of the girls have put
in so much money and we
buy groceries for a lunch
before we go to school every
~~night~~ day. Then we sit our
supper down town. It sure
saves money and we can
make our own good sandwiches

Don't you think it's a
good idea? We have a lot
of fun doing the shopping
and trying to economize on
everything we buy.

The sun is shining today
for a change. I suppose
it will rain before the day
is over. It usually does.

Isn't it doesn't seem possible
that I've been here almost
two weeks. Time is going
pretty fast but I don't
have so awful much time
to write letters. I'd love to
write more but I have
so much work to get done
each day. I'll write more after
when I get home.

The other girls are getting
ready to go to school so I
suppose I'd better start too.
Hoping you are feeling better
and take care of yourself.
Bye for now. I'll be
writing again soon.
