BoB + Mom:

Have a few minutes this evening so I think I will try to drop you a few lines, although there is very little news.

Haven't received any mail for the last few days due to the fact that all available transportation is being used for the phony invasion of Japan and when it is completed old Mac may release a few planes to let our mail get through.

I received a card a few days ago from Esquire and I sent them my address, however I have never received a copy of Esquire.

The Newsweek has been coming through ok and I think I received one copy of the Time magazine.

I do hope that my watch gets here soon as I would really hate to think of

getting lost. I never did
remember that other watch you
sent to me however it might
turn up as my bracelet finally
did and it was in very good
condition I don't remember
exactly when you mailed the
watch but as I remember it
must have been last Feb or March
if you had a return address on
it you may get it back. The
mail situation as a whole
men going home and men
moving around and men coming
from Europe keeps the mail
in a mess I have seen some
letters that have gone to 3 or
4 different A.P.O.'s before they
were reached me, but as soon
as the occupation of Japan is
completed the mail should
be straightened out pretty well.

I haven't heard anything new
on going home and don't expect
to get home for at least a
few more months as all the
transportation is being used
for occupation as you probably
already know over

I do hope that this letter finds Bob getting along OK and about ready to go home for a few days only wish I could be there to meet him when he does get there, but that is almost impossible as you know.

Please don't worry about me as I am feeling OK and getting along just fine and I don't think I will ever have any more malaria as there is very little of it around here in fact I don't know of anyone who has had malaria here for at least 2 mo.

Well I had better close for now and get some sleep. so take care of yourself and I will write again soon.
