I know Bob will be O.K. as he is just the type that can get along with anyone at anytime and in the Army that is the most important thing.

Norma is probably home again, and I do hope that she is feeling herself again after her operation, as it was quite a serious thing. But she will make out O.K. and be back on the job again before you know it. and Larry Ray I bet he is giving you all a busy time, I can just see him taking everything he can get his hands on and giving it a pull just to hear if I used to be.

The last I heard from Larry + Leoria  
was that they were in Yuma, and Larry was  
expecting at anytime, to go over seas, I only  
hope he has been changed around, as I  
would like to have at least one of us  
back home, so he can come to see you  
once in awhile, but there isn't anything you  
can do if he does leave the states, I am  
hoping the war, won't last too much longer,  
so we can all come back home again, which  
will be the greatest day of my life.
